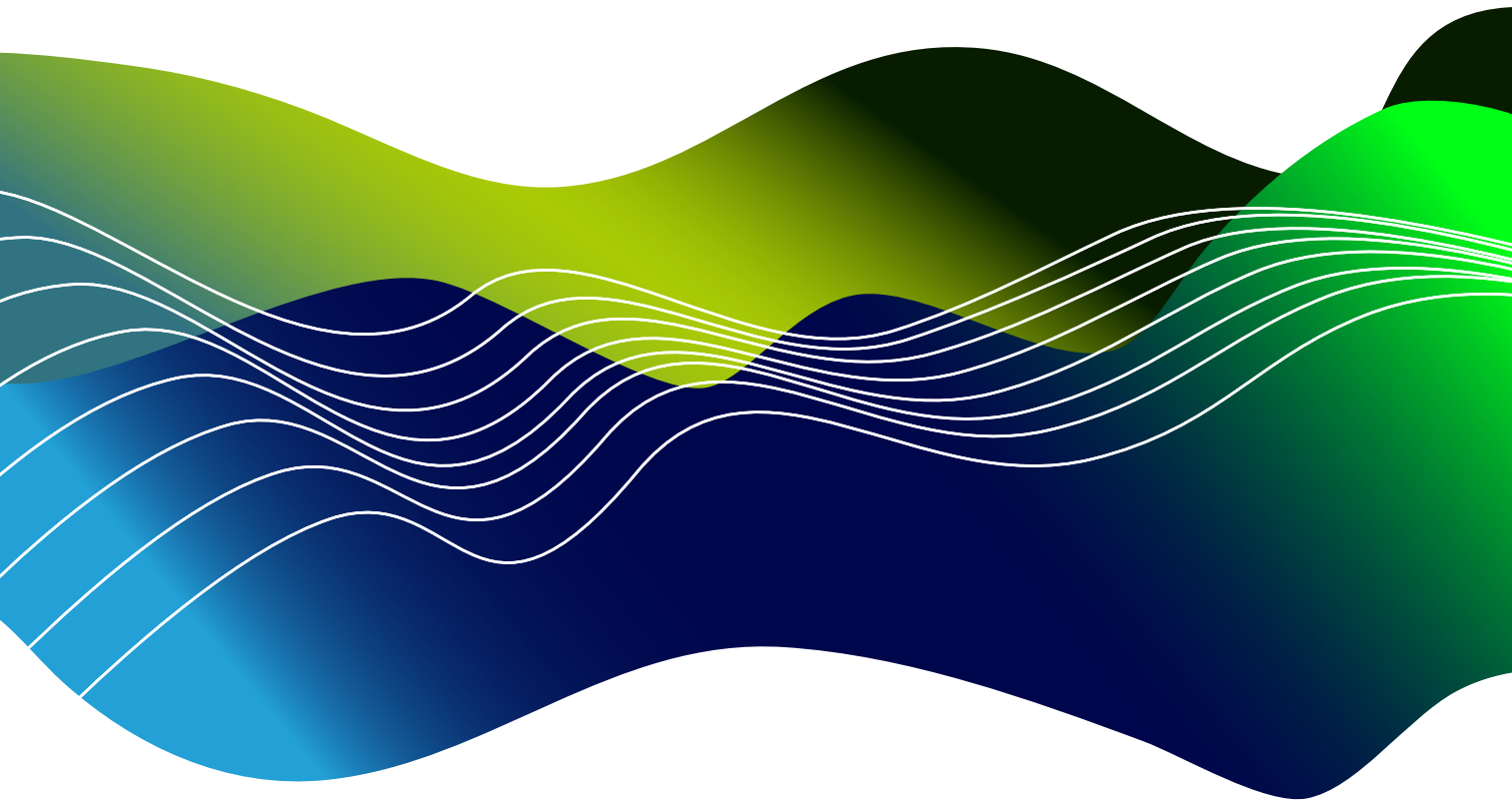

FOREWORD

Transilvania University of Braşov – the largest and most successful university in the Central Region – began the 2025-2026 academic year with 21,875 students enrolled in bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programmes, from all counties in the country and 94 other countries, 44 students from 20 countries enrolled in the Romanian language preparatory year, and 621 resident physicians, as well as 1,341 tenured faculty members, researchers, and administrative staff, alongside 503 adjunct faculty members.

Even in the context of the austerity measures taken by the government (reflected at UNITBV through an increase in the teaching load by two conventional hours and restrictions on staff hiring), stimulating the performance of human resources – students and teaching staff – the most important resource of our university, has been a priority for UNITBV's management team. We continued to implement the differentiated salary system for teaching staff and researchers, based on a set of performance indicators of both teaching and scientific nature, as well as programmes to attract high-achieving young people: high school valedictorians, graduates with a perfect score on the baccalaureate exam, Olympiad winners, etc. As a result of the Ministry of Education and Research's reduction in scholarship funding, the university financed both need-based scholarships and merit-based scholarships and awards – designed to reward student achievements or their involvement in the university's development – from its own revenues.

In 2025, the process of digitizing academic and administrative activities continued. The platform for reporting research activities was changed, and the development of applications for students continued: the expansion of the mobile app – student@unitbv.ro – the development of the internship app, improvements to the digital student ID card's functions, the digitization of the process for reimbursing travel passes, and enhancements to the digital system for managing student housing, among others. At the same time, the programme to restore and renovate UNITBV's educational and social infrastructure continued, particularly the buildings in the historic centre of Braşov and within the Colina Universităţii campus; construction work also continued on the new dormitory next to the Library, a project carried out by the National Investment Company.

As in previous years, the study programmes maintained a high degree of stability, with the university continuing its efforts to expand the range of programmes offered in widely spoken languages (particularly at the master's level) and to develop new doctoral programmes. The number and quality of articles published in prestigious journals also increased, with the number of Web of Science-indexed articles and reviews by staff affiliated with UNITBV exceeding 1,000 for the first time. Furthermore, the process of modernizing the research infrastructure at the university's Research and Development Institute continued (particularly with funding from the National Recovery and Resilience Plan and research projects). In 2025, the university remained actively involved in the artistic and intellectual life of Braşov, maintaining its status as a local cultural landmark through the organization of numerous

events by the Music Centre, the Multicultural Centre, and the Norbert Detaeye Media Library. In collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and with financial support from the Ministry of Education and Research, UNITBV students and staff provided daily cultural programmes at the Romanian pavilion at the Osaka World Expo for five months, and in partnership with Romania's diplomatic missions, performances and exhibitions by students and faculty members were organized abroad.

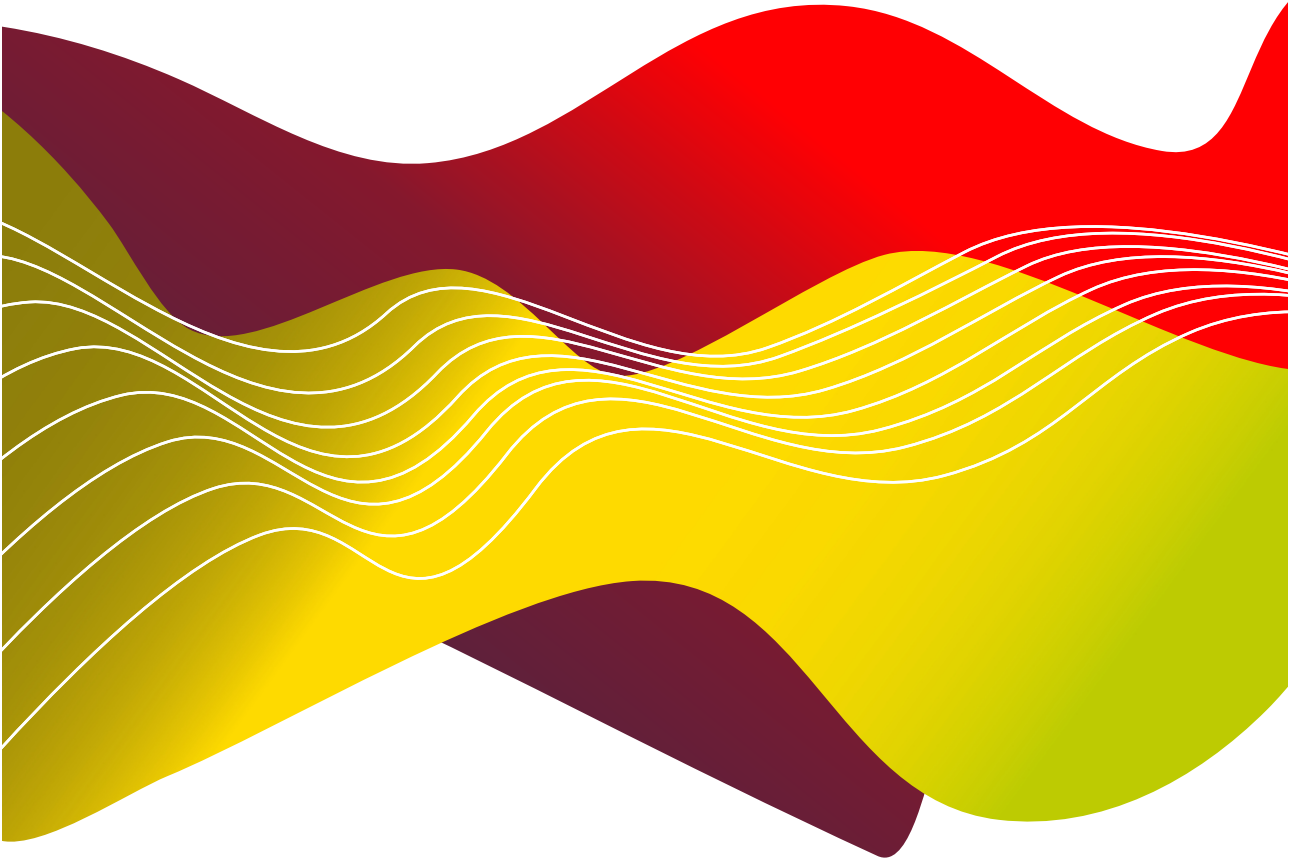
By the end of 2025, the number of partner institutions had reached 791, from 94 countries worldwide, and the number of full-time students had risen to 650, from 94 countries. In 2025, the number of scholarships funded by UNITBV increased significantly, including through the "Transilvania Academica Scholarship" programme and the doctoral scholarship programme for UNITBV's international students. Transilvania University of Braşov actively participated this year in the activities of the UNITA Alliance of European Universities, a project serving as a catalyst for the integration of our student and faculty community into the European higher education space.

The university's annual revenue was 410.3 million lei, and expenses were 398.4 million lei, with the university recording a cumulative budget surplus of over 239.5 million lei at the end of 2025. The achievements of our community, in a year with a budget influenced by the government's austerity measures, reflect the extraordinary efforts of faculty, researchers, and administrative staff, alongside our students, to develop the university and promote it nationally and internationally.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITY

Transilvania University of Braşov is the largest university in Romania's Centre Region. It is a mature university that has gained highly significant prestige over time at national and international level. Its stability and strength derive both from the wide diversity and from the unity of its integral parts. A comprehensive university, UNITBV offers Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes in over 40 fields (engineering, mathematics and computer science, biomedical sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities, as well as sports and physical education). The educational offer meets the professional requirements of the labour market, especially in terms of Master's and continuous education programmes. The university structure includes programmes designed in collaboration with the companies that are traditional employers of UNITBV graduates, as well as niche programmes that anticipate the society's need for professional training in new areas of knowledge. This is why some programmes do not run every academic year as they are replaced by others which are of interest for the candidates. The sections dedicated to Bachelor's degree study programmes and Master's degree study programmes offer information about the Bachelor's and Master's programmes active in the 2025 – 2026 academic year.

The teaching infrastructure is subject to continuous improvement as the university provides students with access to ergonomic spaces, state-of-the-art equipment and updated scientific information, as well as to an e-learning platform.

All the study programmes are accredited or authorized by the National Agency for Quality Assurance in Higher Education, that evaluated the university in 2007, in 2013, in 2018 and in 2023, and awarded the grade "high degree of reliability".

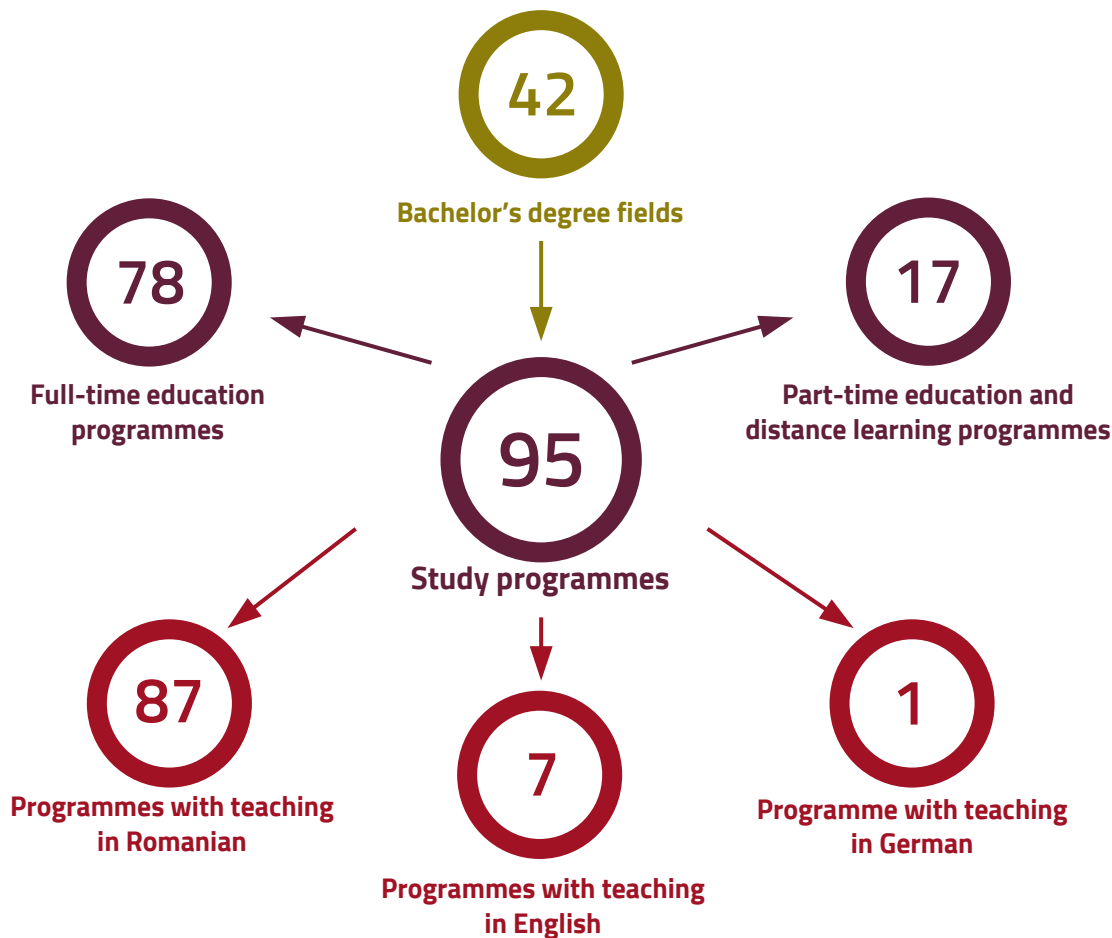

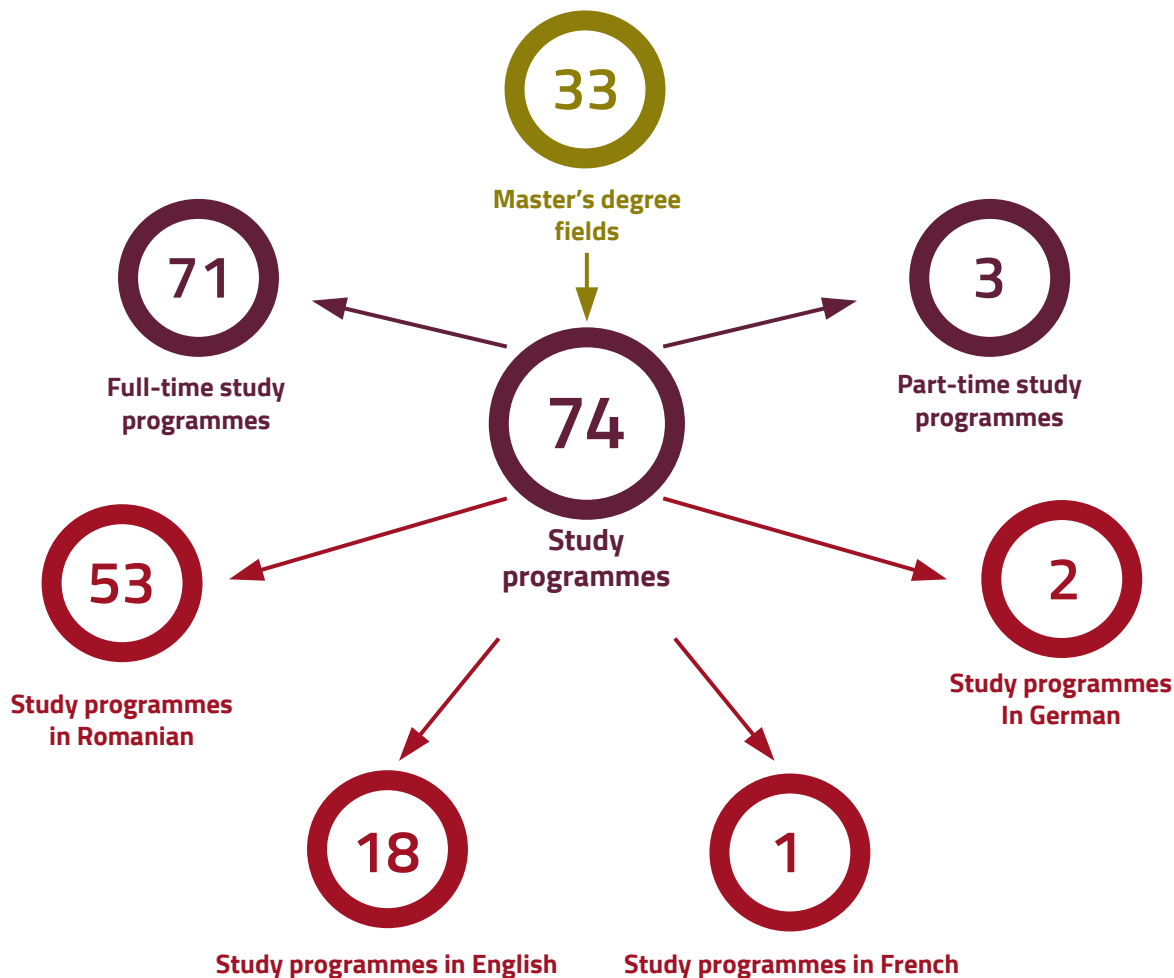

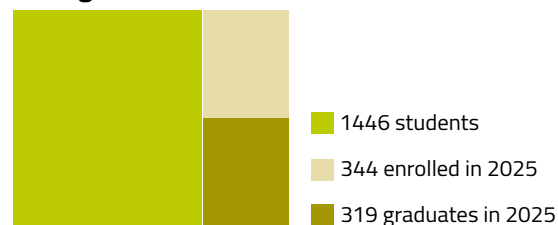

Number of enrolled students and graduates at bachelor's degree, by fields

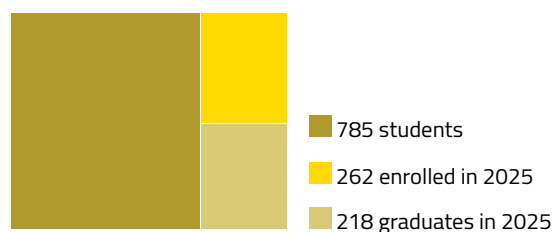

Enrollement and graduation by fields at bachelor's degree level

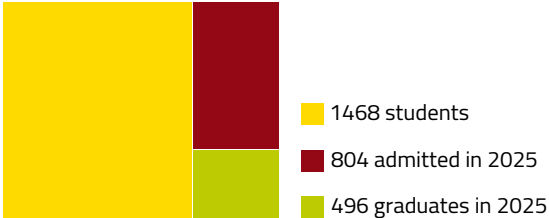

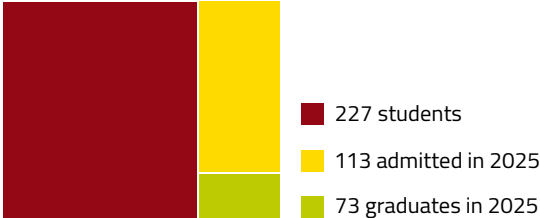

Number of enrolled students and graduates at masters's degree, by fields

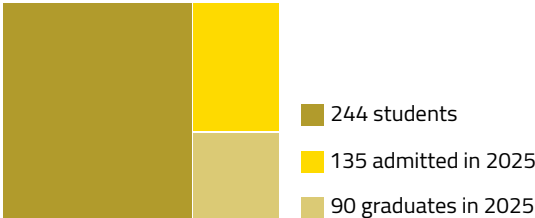

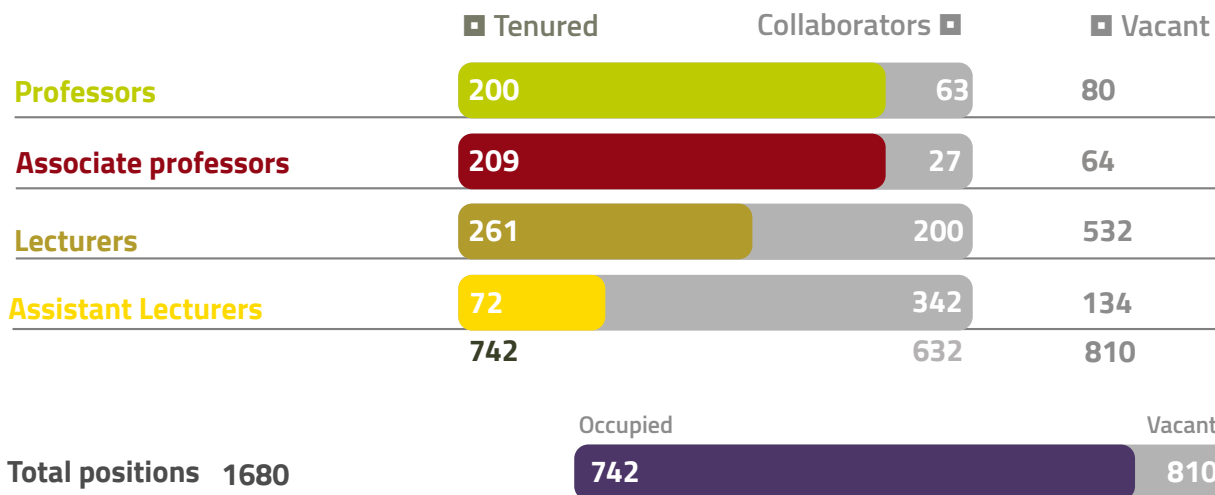

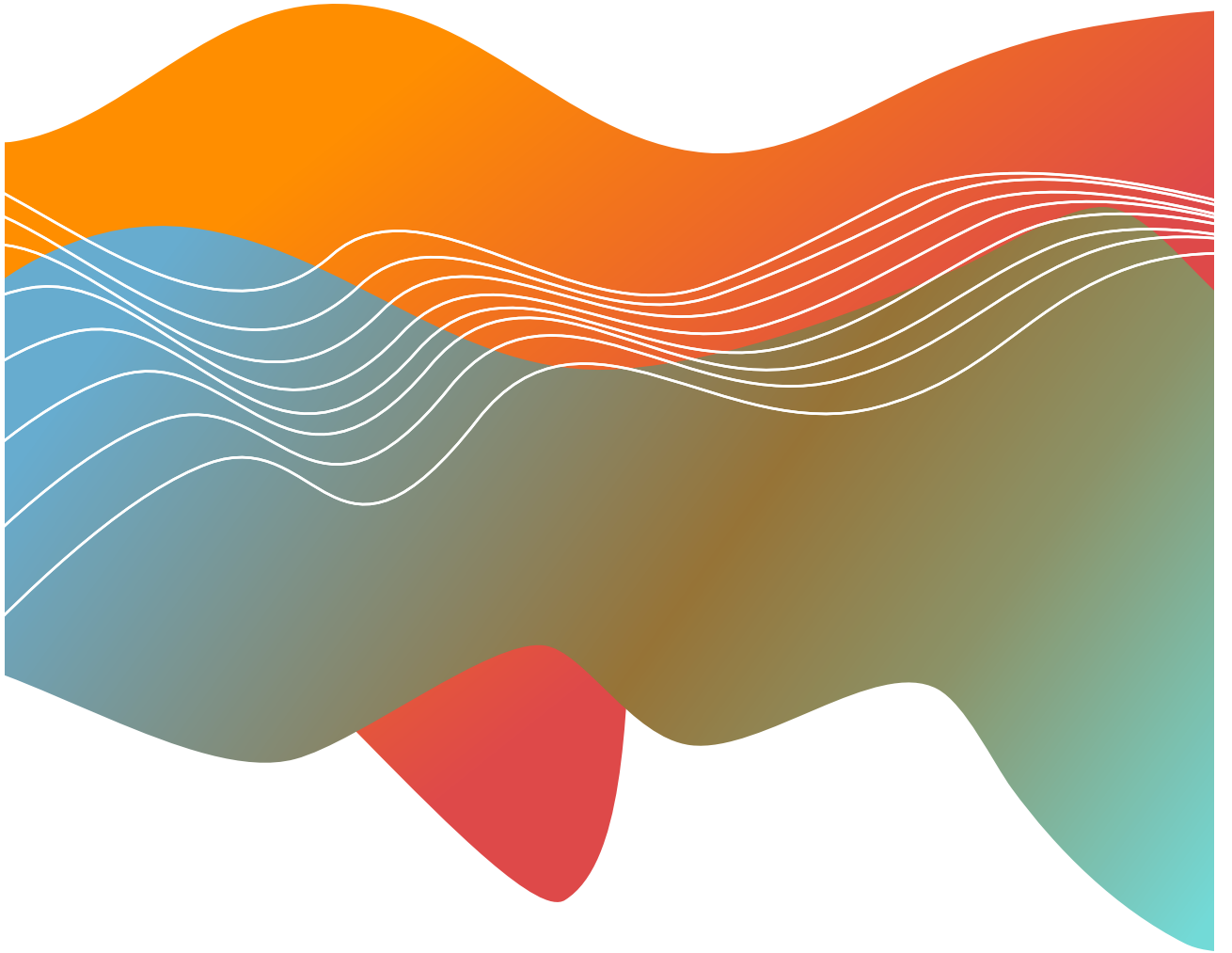


The recognition of the qualities of the academic teaching personnel through a consistent financial reward (increase of the monthly salary by RON 1500 for one year) is a means by which UNITBV annually stimulates the performance of its academic staff in terms of their activity with students.

UNITBV is the only Romanian university to have implemented the programme "The most appreciated professor of the graduating class", which has been running since 2017-2018. The mechanism by which this programme is applied involves each graduate's secret "vote" (cast before the final exam) for the most appreciated professors.

The salary increase is granted to: (a) the members of the academic staff who received the highest number of "votes" from the Bachelor's degree graduates, and (b) the members of the academic staff who totalled the highest percentage of "votes" from the Bachelor's and Master's degree graduates (15% of the total number of tenured academic personnel in each case).

In 2025, based on the votes of the year's graduates, 234 academic staff members (60 professors, 70 associate professors, 84 lecturers and 20 assistant lecturers) received the salary increase based on their performance as evaluated by the graduates.



RESEARCH

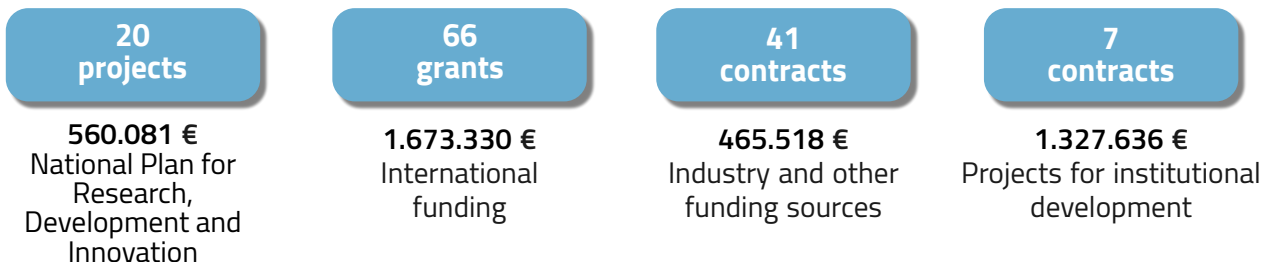
Interdisciplinary research is both a natural reflection of the comprehensive structure of the university (which integrates branches of engineering, social sciences, humanities, arts, medical sciences, mathematics, sports, and physical education), as well as a strategic direction for the institution's recognition at regional and international level. In 2025, the results of the 742 teaching staff members and 51 researchers follow the trend of improving performance, both in terms of the increase in the number of articles published in prestigious journals and in terms of the quality of the results obtained (the visibility and scope of research projects, the international partnerships developed, the diversification of methods for disseminating research results, etc.). The results of the research activity are also confirmed by the honourable positions that the university occupies in international and national rankings.

In 2025, the university implemented 127 grants, projects, and contracts for scientific research and technical assistance, with a total amount received of EUR 2,698,929. In addition, 7 institutional projects were financially carried out, aiming at developing research and education activities (PNRR, PS, FDI-D6, Erasmus+ UNITA Alliance), with a total amount received of EUR 1,327,636.

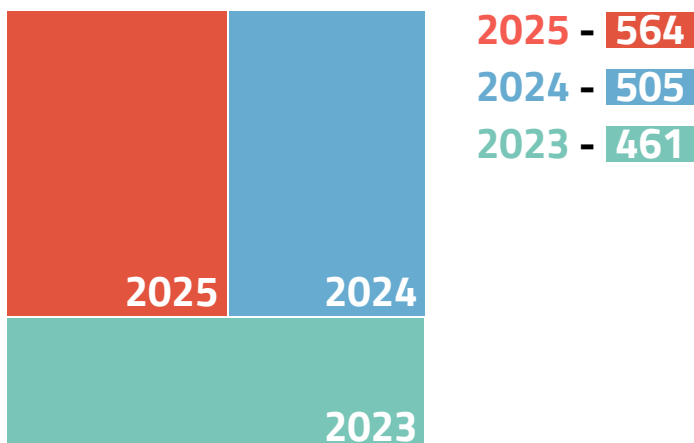
To bolster research endeavours and strengthen international partnerships in 2025, a suite of internal programmes has been devised for faculty members, researchers, and students.

There was a noticeable rise in the number of articles published in journals with commendable scientometric ratings (i.e. impact factor, relative influence score). A large number of teaching staff, researchers, and doctoral students publish in prestigious journals indexed in ISI WoS/Clarivate Analytics.

**STUDENTS AND THE RELATION
WITH THE ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT**

The year 2025 was marked by continuous progress in terms of the relationship with students and collaboration with the economic and socio-cultural environment. Students' academic performance was supported through scholarships and awards for academic achievement, while involvement in continuous improvement activities at campus level (within various student groups or individually) was rewarded through special scholarships. Students facing social difficulties were granted social scholarships and other means of support (free accommodation and/or meals, reduction/waiver of tuition fees, etc.). Regarding the various types of scholarships and other forms of financial support offered by Transilvania University of Braşov (UNITBV), the Nomenclature of Scholarships – UNITBV was developed.

Particular emphasis was placed on programmes aimed at motivating and supporting high-performing young people. Such programmes addressed high school graduates who chose to study at UNITBV as valedictorians of their graduating class, as well as Bachelor's degree graduates – valedictorians of their faculties – who chose to continue their studies in UNITBV's Master's programmes. Faculty valedictorians were awarded during the Valedictorians' Gala, including participation in an experience exchange trip to the University of Salerno – Italy. Members of the Formula Student team – BlueStreamline were also supported and awarded (the Top Performer at UNITBV Award) for the outstanding results achieved at international level.

The relationship with the economic environment was highlighted by the traditional meetings among representatives of the university, faculties, and the economic sector, within the Councils of partners from the economic and socio-cultural environment, held both at university and faculty level. In this context, the development of the Companies' Podium at UNITBV project continued, and a series of events and scientific sessions were organized, such as a new edition of the Graduates in front of Companies – AFCO 2025 event, the 2025 Student Scientific Circles Session, and the SAS-UNITBV Hackathon.

Throughout 2025, Transilvania University of Braşov continued allocating resources to the development and modernization processes of the university campus, in order to ensure optimal study and living conditions for students.

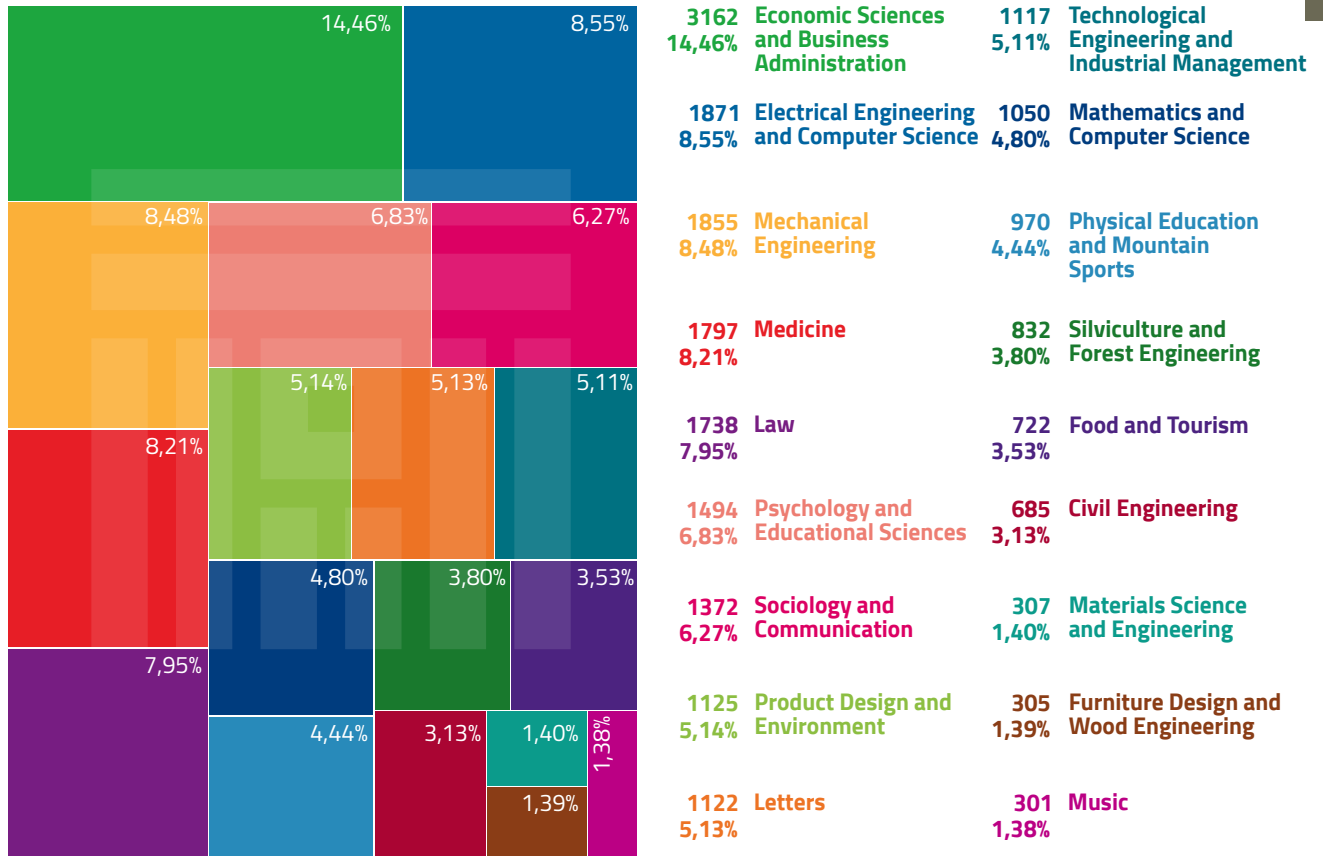

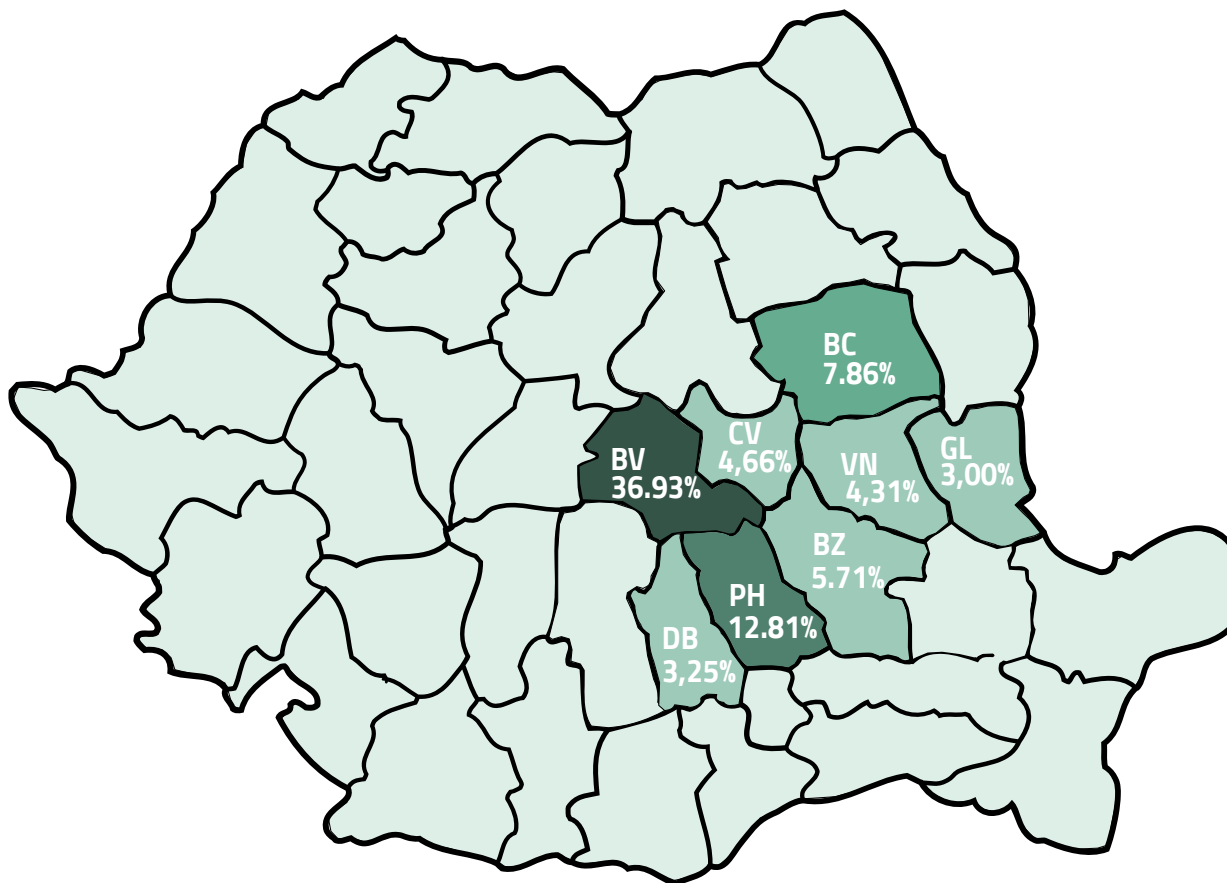

The Career Counselling and Guidance Centre (CCOC) supports high school students, university students, and graduates in clarifying their career options and expectations, contributing to their personal and professional development. The specific activities are carried out by a multidisciplinary team composed of psychologists, educators, faculty members from each department, and experts from the socio-economic environment, with the objective of increasing the employability of the beneficiaries.

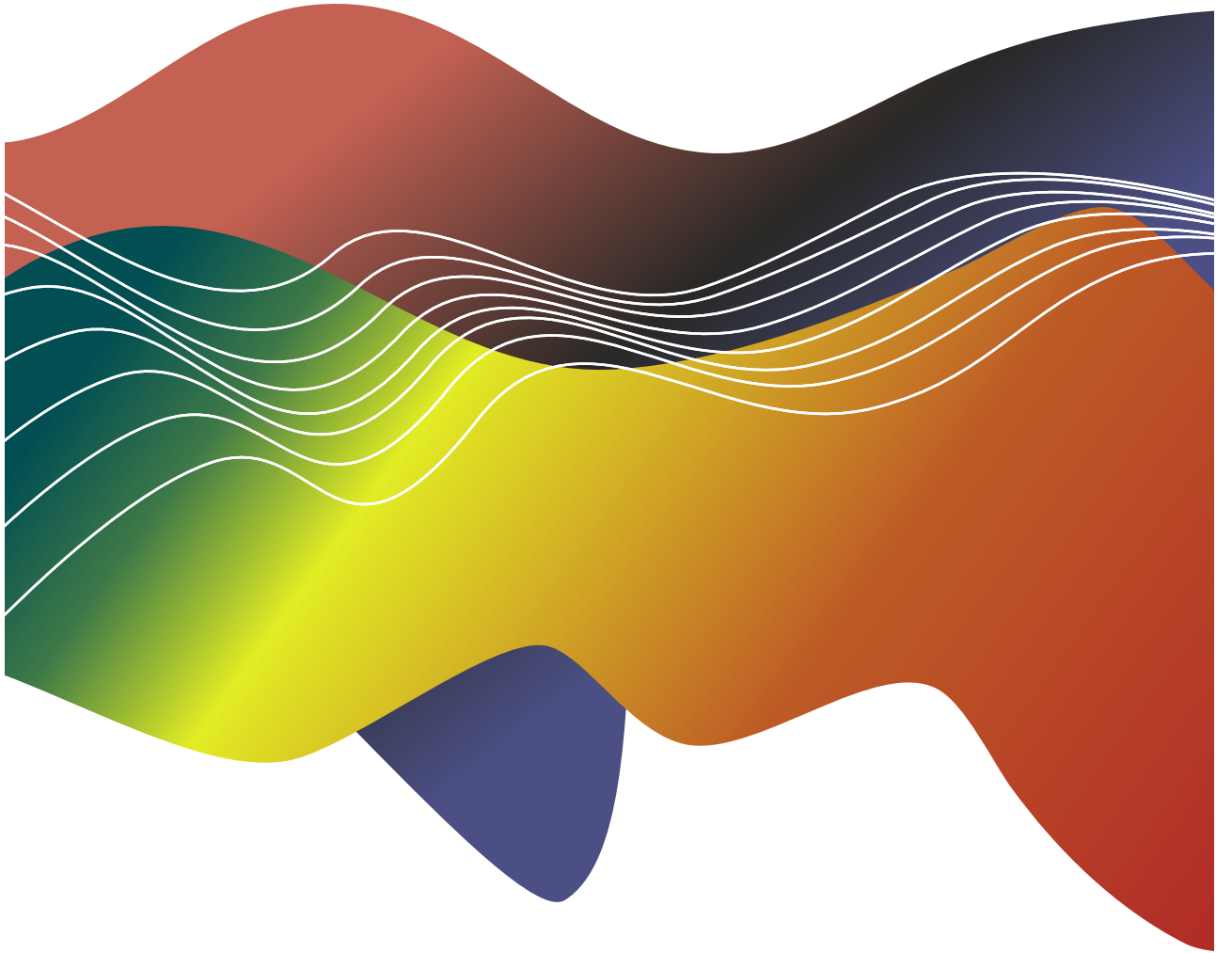

Education and cultural vibrancy remained fundamental pillars in 2025 as well. They served as an essential link between the academic community and society. Our goal is that of increasing Romania's visibility and furthering the university's internationalisation. This ongoing effort was strongly reflected in our cultural and artistic agenda, as well as in our participation in sports and scientific activities, with this year's figures perfectly illustrating this dynamic.

INTERNATIONALIZATION

In 2025, internationalization continued to be one of the key strategic priorities of Transilvania University of Braşov, strengthening the institution's role as an active and credible player in the European higher education landscape. In a dynamic international context, marked by the acceleration of academic cooperation and the emergence of new European initiatives, the university sought both to expand existing partnerships and to develop innovative forms of collaboration, focused on academic excellence, societal relevance, and international impact.

A central element of the activities in 2025 was active involvement in the European alliance UNITA – Universitas Montium, which provided a solid framework for the development of joint programmes, expanded academic mobility, and integrated educational initiatives. Through its participation in this alliance, Transilvania University of Braşov contributes to shaping a model of an open, connected, and student-centred European university, in which transnational cooperation becomes a natural tool for institutional development.

Furthermore, the year 2025 was marked by an increase in international mobility, both for students and for faculty and administrative staff, as well as by the enrichment of educational programmes in internationally used languages. Particular attention was paid to attracting international students and creating an inclusive academic environment capable of meeting the needs of an increasingly diverse university community.

At the same time, the university continued to develop strategic partnerships with prestigious institutions in Europe and beyond, to actively participate in academic networks, and promote international research and education projects.

Overall, the results of 2025 confirm that internationalization is no longer merely a complementary aspect of university activity, but a fundamental pillar of the strategic development of Transilvania University of Braşov. Through the sustained efforts of the entire academic community, our university is consolidating its position in the European and international arena, actively contributing to the formation of a generation of competitive graduates, equipped to meet global challenges.

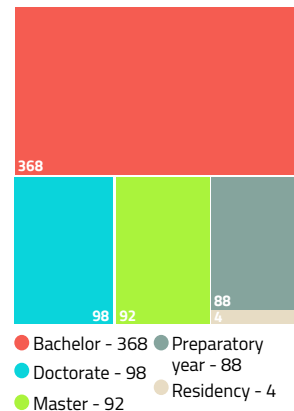

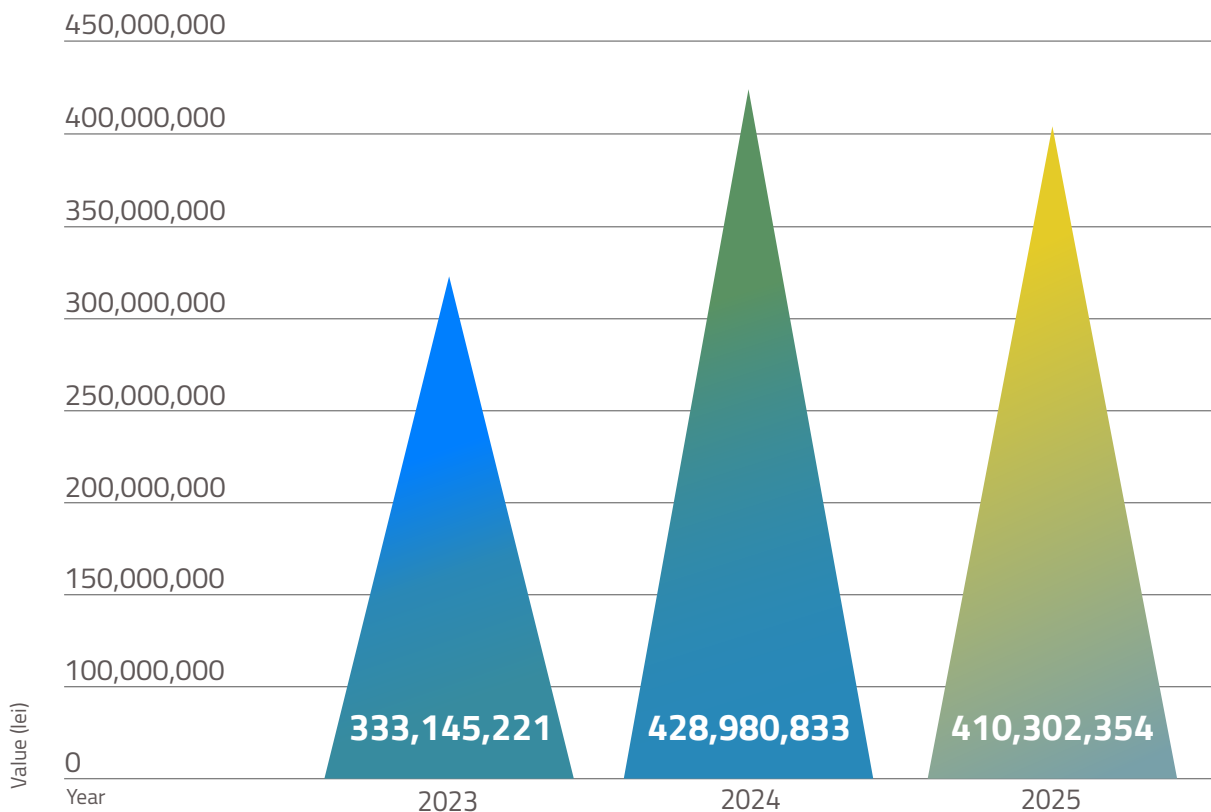

Revenues

The total revenues collected in 2025, originating from subsidies to public institutions and own revenue, amount to RON **410,302,354**, marking a decrease of **5%** compared to those recorded in 2024, and an increase of **23.16%** compared to those recorded in 2023.

Revenues in RON collected in 2025 by sources of origin

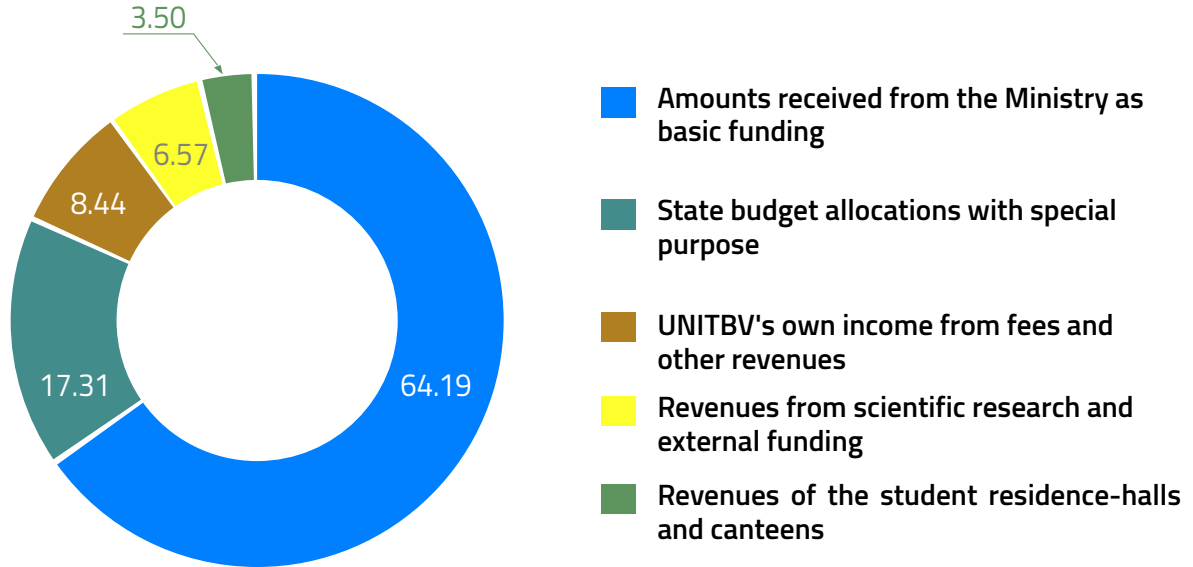

In 2025, the university's self-financing degree, derived from tuition fees, administrative fees, donations and sponsorships, rents, scientific research, student residence-halls and canteens, and from non-refundable financing amounted to **18.51%**. The remaining **81.49%** was covered by funding from the Ministry of Education and Research as basic financing, and through allocations from the state budget with a special purpose.

Expenditure

In the reported period, Transilvania University of Braşov made total payments of RON 398,475,454, by RON 11,826,900 less than the revenues actually collected in the fiscal year under analysis.

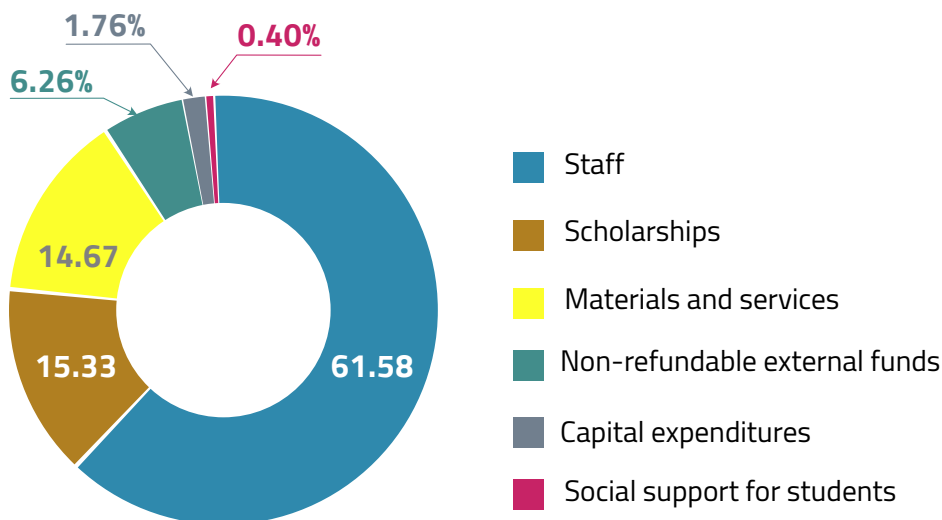
The growth rate of total expenditure in 2025 was lower than that of total revenue collected, thereby positively impacting the budgetary outcome by increasing it.

Capital expenditures and expenditures from non-refundable external funds recorded a lower share in total expenditures compared to the previous year; moreover, the scholarship fund was reduced in the second half of the year as a result of the modification of the allocation per student and of the scholarship allocation period, in accordance with Law no. 141/25.07.2025 regarding certain fiscal-budgetary measures.

Results of the budget execution

In accordance with Article 59 (1) of the Public Finance Law No. 500/2002, the budget outcome is determined by the variance between revenues and expenditures.

In this context, as of December 31, 2025, Transilvania University of Braşov registered a budget surplus, reflected in the liquid assets available in accounts held with the Braşov Treasury and commercial banks, as follows:

- Liquid assets in Braşov Treasury = RON 205,823,195, of which:
 - surplus related to budget execution = RON 204,702,618
 - Norwegian EAA mechanism surplus = RON 11,293
 - liquid assets in special accounts = RON 1,109,284

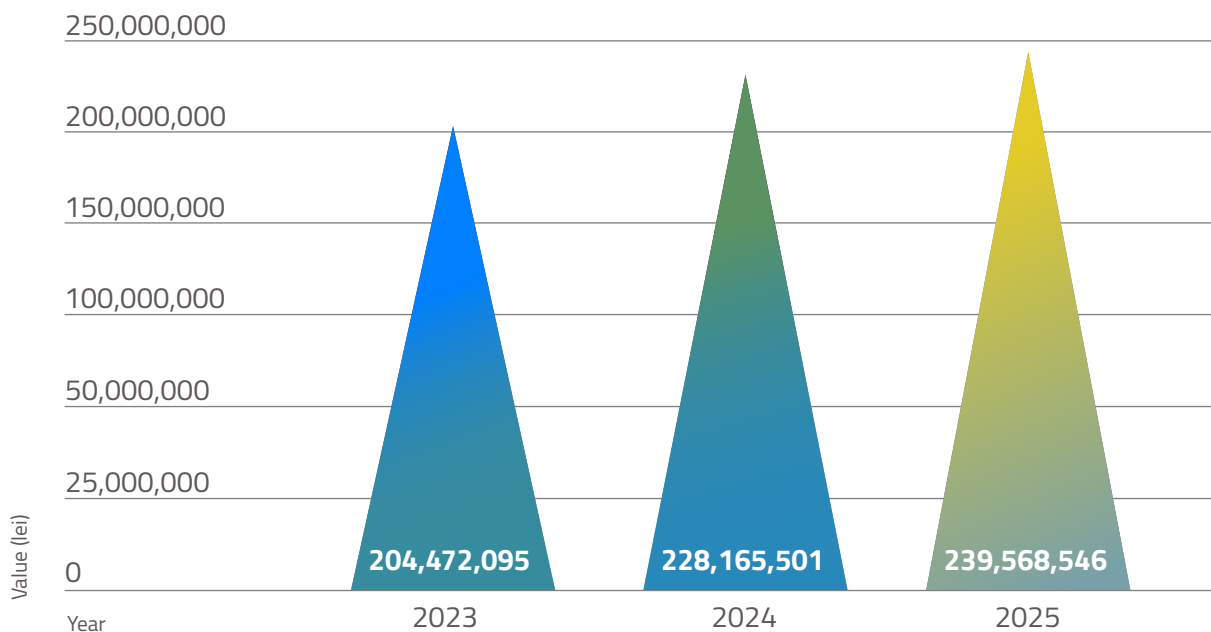

The analysis revealed that the surplus recorded is relatively constant and is generated 85.92% by the core activity carried out through the State Treasury accounts, and 14.08% by the activity conducted through commercial banks.

The financial statements as of December 31, 2025 provide a faithful view of the financial position and other information related to the carried out activity.
