Summary of Habilitation Thesis

The Habilitation Thesis entitled *Volunteering, prosocial behavior and interventions* within organizations is structured in three parts: a brief presentation of the main scientific results; a description of experience in coordinating research teams and organizing educational processes; career development and future career plans. The approach to writing the thesis is that of social psychology ("the most humane of the humanities" - Chelcea, 2006,19), an area in which I completed my master's and doctoral studies and in which most of my didactic and scientific concerns are anchored.

The first part comprises the main original published scientific results or the professional achievements made public by the candidate, after his achievement of the doctoral degree (in 2009) in the doctoral field of Sociology. The evolution of the academic, scientific and professional career is also described hereby, as well as the main directions of its development (by reference to the context of significant and current scientific achievements in the specialized field of Sociology).

The presentation of the main professional and scientific results has been accomplished within two major themes:

- 1) Volunteering and prosocial behavior;
- 2) Theory and practice of psychosocial intervention (in several types of organizational environments: educational organizations; organizations involved in community development and defense organizations)

The second part of the paper encompasses a description of the candidate's expertise in:

- coordinating research teams (in an academic context and/or the implementation of grants with non-reimbursable funding);
- organizing and conducting didactic activities, within the academic departments in which he worked;
- explaining and facilitating learning and research, by participating in conferences and other events intended for the scientific community and/or the general public.

In both parts, the presentation is done chronologically, with examples inserted in the text in the form of *hyperlinks*.

In the final part of the paper, the evolution of my professional career and development plans are described, both in terms of the teaching career and scientific activity.
