

TRANSILVANIA UNIVERSITY OF BRAȘOV, PRESENT AGAIN IN *TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION* INTERNATIONAL RANKING

Transilvania University of Braşov was again included in *Times Higher Education* academic ranking, but this time in the section "Emerging economies". Our University can be found on the 501+ place, being for the first time in this category within the ranking.

This ranking is based on 13 performance indicators grouped into five general fields: teaching (didactic activity), research or scientific performance (through volume, income and reputation), research influence (citations), international outlook (through the academic community, students, research) and knowledge transfer to industry / society. The complete results and further details about the ranking "Times Higher Education - emerging economies" can be accessed from the link here.



"Times Higher Education – emerging economies" ranking includes only institutions in countries classified by the FTSE Group of the London Stock Exchange as "advanced emerging", "secondary emerging" or "frontier". The top includes 606 universities from 48 countries around the world, the economy of which was classified as either advanced, secondary "emerging" or frontier. From Romania, 13 universities were included in this top. In the second part of the ranking, on the 251st-300th places, there

are the Academy of Economic Sciences of Bucharest, Babeş Bolyai University and the University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Cluj Napoca. On the 501+ places, there are 10 other Romanian universities, mentioned in alphabetical order, including Transilvania University of Braşov.

Transilvania University of Braşov entered for the first time *Times Higher Education* ranking, in September 2020, in the general *World University Rankings 2021*, which included the best-performing 1,527 universities from over 20,000 higher education institutions in 93 countries and regions, and can be considered the most comprehensive and diverse university ranking to date.

Recently, Transilvania University of Brașov has registered the highest ascent of a Romanian university in the international ranking *Center for World University Rankings* (CWUR), as well as in the international QS ranking of the universities in Emerging Europe and Central Asia. It also entered for the first time the prestigious Shanghai international ranking by fields and the international ranking *Times Higher Education – Impact Rankings* (the third place in the top of Romanian universities).

SEVEN NATIONAL AWARDS OBTAINED AS A STUDENT OF THE FACULTY OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND MOUNTAIN SPORTS

The Faculty of Physical Education and Mountain Sports is also successfully represented in men's speed skating. If in a previous issue of the newsletter we talked about our students Mihaela Hogaș and Bianca Lorena Stănică, today we will present Cosmin Nedelea (Mex – as his friends and colleagues call him), the athlete who won seven national awards in a sport in which Romania does not even have a competition track (400 m skating rink).



Cosmin is a second-year student at the programme Sports and Motor Performance, within our faculty. He is optimistic, ambitious and friendly by nature. He switched to speed skating at the age of eight, having started on rollers; then he got up on ice, abandoning football, a sport that his mother had taken him to. In the 13 years dedicated to performance sports, Mex succeeded in collecting over 100 medals. We must emphasize here that in the first five years of performance he did not succeed in "getting" a place on the podium.





The important competitions in which he participated include the European Youth Olympics Festival (FOTE) - Turkey 2017, the World Junior Championship - Italy 2019 and several stages of the World Cup for Juniors and Neo-Seniors. In addition, the last year's performances stood out by:

- 1st place at the National Long Track Championship - Zakopane, Polonia;
- 1st place at the National Short Track Championship - Miercurea Ciuc, România;
- 1st place at the Romanian Speed Skating Cup;
- 1st place at Tatra Cup, Zakopane, Poland (500 m);
- Participation in several international competitions at Inzell, Germany.

Mex is trained by the same Bogdan Stănescu, a graduate of our faculty, who is for the speed skaters in the team of Cosmin, Mihaela and Bianca, both coach and masseur, as well as chef, driver, etc.

THE 11TH EDITION OF THE *INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON INFORMATION SCIENCE AND INFORMATION LITERACY* (ICISIL 2021)

The 11th edition of the *International Conference on Information Science and Information Literacy* (ICISIL 2021) took place on 11 and 12 March 2021. This event was organized by Transilvania University of Braşov, Lucian Blaga University of Sibiu and Politehnica University of Timişoara, with the support of George Bariţiu County Library of Braşov, and of MB Think Tank.



The theme of this year's conference was "The Role of Information in Services Provided to Innovative Users", and the participants registered at this event (on the platform www.icisil2021.com) gave presentations followed by discussions in which the recent results of the research were debated, in a 100% online format.

On 11 March, those interested could attend the official opening ceremony, through the words addressed by the special guests of this event: Prof. Dr. MD. Liliana Rogozea, Vice-Rector for Public Relations of Transilvania University of Braşov, Prof. Dr. Sorin Radu, Rector of Lucian Blaga University of Sibiu, Prof. Dr. Andrei Terian-Dan, Vice-Rector for Research, Innovation and Internationalization of Lucian Blaga University of Sibiu, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Eng. Florin Drăgan, Rector of Politehnica University of Timișoara, Dr. Daniel Nazare, Director of George Barițiu County Library of Brașov.

The presentations on the conference sections respectively "Media and Information Literacy" – 14 papers, and "Information Science and Technology" – 18 papers, came next, under the careful coordination of the chair of the organizing committee, Prof. Dr. Eng. Dr. Marketing Angela Repanovici.



In the second part of the event, on 12 March, the registered participants benefited from the information and activities carried out in an online workshop dedicated to 3D printing technology, a special event within the Eramus+ project "3D Printing Support Service for Innovative Citizens - INNO3D", each of them receiving a digital certificate attesting to this participation. There were 552 participants from 26 countries.



Finally, another point of interest was the workshop dedicated to doctoral students, where over 12 presentations reflected the high level of the research topics approached by the authors. The papers in extenso of the international conference will be published in a collective volume, indexed through the services of Sciendo, a subsidiary of De Gruyter Publishing House.

THE INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SYMPOSIUM "CADET INOVA'21", SIBIU

The international student symposium "The International Student Innovation and Scientific Research Exhibition - Cadet INOVA'21" took place at Sibiu between 15 and 17 March 2021 (https://cadetinova.ro/index.php/ro/). This event was promoted by "Gl. mr. Nicolae Uscoi" Cadet Corps and "Nicolae Bălcescu" Land Forces Academy of Sibiu, under the High Patronage of the Romanian Inventors Forum, aiming to support innovation and scientific research at national and international level in the young researchers' vision. Forty-four scientific papers were submitted to this scientific event, which were evaluated by a jury of researchers and experts in various fields.



Within this event, the students Roxana Gall and Eugenia Filimon, in the 2nd study year at the Faculty of Furniture Design and Wood Engineering, Transilvania University of Braşov, participated with the papers: "Application of X-Ray Computed Tomography in geometrical analysis on the design", supervisors: Assoc. Prof. Dr. Eng. Mariana Domnica Stanciu, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Florin Dinulică, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Alina Nauncef, and "Research regarding the vibration analysis of heritage violins versus new violins", supervisors: Assoc. Prof. Dr. Eng. Mariana Domnica Stanciu, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Eng. The topics of the papers, the high scientific level and the way of presentation were appreciated by the jury, our students obtaining three prizes:

- ➤ Gold Medal Award the equivalent of the first prize;
- > Silver Medal Award (second prize);
- > Award of the Romanian Inventors Forum.





The researches were conducted within the project "Innovative models of violins acoustically and aesthetically comparable with patrimony violins – MINOVIS", code PN-III-P2-2.1-PED-2019-2148, contract no. 568PED/2020, in which students participate voluntarily, and the video recording was made with the support of the company A.P. 3D PRINTING CENTRE COORDINATED BY VOLUNTEER STUDENTS AT TRANSILVANIA UNIVERSITY

Transilvania University of Braşov inaugurated on the Day of Transilvania University, on 1 March, a free 3D printing centre, dedicated to students, which is located on Colina Campus, in A building. The idea to inaugurate this centre came from the need to offer students the production service and the space where to print the 3D components required in the realization of various teaching and research projects. The university management equipped the centre with eight 3D printers, laptops, a 2D printer and furniture for the proper conduct of the activities.





The organization of the centre and the printing services are provided by seven volunteer students from the Faculty of Product Design and Environment, specializations Mechatronics and Medical Engineering, and one student from the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science.

All UNITBV students have free access to these printers, and the consumables will be provided by Transilvania University of Braşov. They only need to send to the email address of the centre

<u>inno3D@unitbv.ro</u> a print request approved by the coordinating professor of the project.

The eight printers, Prusa model, print objects in 3D format, with polymers - plastics. The maximum size of a printable object is 20 centimetres.





The students are coordinated and assisted by the team of professors from the Faculty of Product and Environment Design, members of the project *3D Printing Support Service for Innovative Citizens* – INNO3D, project *ERASMUS+ Strategic Partnerships for Higher Education*, 2019-1-IE02-KA03-000693.

Guides for 3D printing, videos with simulations of the printing process and the curriculum needed to train the staff who want to develop 3D printing services have been made within the project

START-UP FUNDING. FINANCING SOLUTIONS IN SUPPORT OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP

On the occasion of the day of Transilvania University of Braşov, the team of ITA UNITBV Technological and Business Incubator organized the virtual meeting on the financing of start-ups, entitled "Start-up funding. Financing solutions in support of entrepreneurship".



The event was honoured by the presence of two distinguished guests. These are Roxana Mînzatu, an expert in non-reimbursable financing, and Bogdan Merfea, an expert in banking and non-banking financing. The two guests' vast experience was proven by their stories, dense in useful information, and consequential especially for young people who want to engage in business or who want to start a new business.

The meeting was opened with a welcome from the university management, through the Vice-Rector Carmen Buzea, who emphasized the usefulness of such information in the process of cultivating the entrepreneurial spirit among students and graduates.

Mrs. Roxana Mînzatu presented in detail Innotech Student programme, bringing a whole series of additional details to those interested, as a result of her expertise in the Startup Nation non-reimbursable financing programme.

Mr. Bogdan Merfea reviewed several banking and non-banking sources of business financing. His expertise as a professor at Transilvania University of Braşov (from which he detached himself in 1999), along with the complex banking and non-banking business development activities carried out in the meantime also led to a dense presentation in information, very useful for young entrepreneurs.

The ensuing extensive discussions were meant to highlight details that were considered important for young entrepreneurs or for those thinking of taking the step towards starting a business.






CREATIVE ADVERTISING CAMPAIGNS IN ROMANIA AND BRAZIL

After the *4Branding Challenge* event of 24 November 2020, another online duplex was created between Transilvania University in Braşov, through the Faculty of Sociology and Communication, and UniChristus University in Fortaleza, Brasil, on 30 March 2021.



If at the last joint meeting, four months ago, the topic was branding, now the topic of online dialogue between Romanian and Brazilian students focused around creative advertising campaigns in the two countries.





The previous format was kept, respectively two presentations of the Brazilian students and two presentations of the Romanian students, the change occurring only at the level of the group of participating students: 1st-year students at the master's study programme Branding Campaign Management, and 3rd-year students at the programme Communication and Public Relations.



Moreover, the event was also attended by students in various study years at the bachelor's degree programmes Communication and Public Relations and Digital Media. A guest from outside the two universities was Sorin Psatta, former Director of strategy at the first international advertising agency established in Romania, Graffiti BBDO, and associated Professor at the Faculty of Journalism and Communication, University of Bucharest. He also talked about his experience as a volunteer in Rio de Janeiro almost a decade ago.

THE WAY TO THE BEST VERSION OF OUR SELF IN... DIALOGUES ABOUT EDUCATION

Critical thinking and emotional self-regulation are two characteristics of a mature personality, towards which we tend in our daily effort towards fulfilment.



From whom can we learn how to obtain them, if not from those who deal with the education (training and development) of these characteristics, namely from the professors of the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences?

That is why, this year's edition of the *Dialogues* about Education, held on the occasion of the Day of Transilvania University of Braşov, together with one of the established partners of our faculty, Şt. O. losif Library, had as its theme of debate two interesting and topical works through the issues addressed: critical thinking and emotional education.

The possibility of forming critical thinking, models of critical thinkers, the benefits and risks of assuming critical thinking were the main topics of reflection, which Lect. Dr. Oana Alina Bota submitted to attention, together with Assoc. Prof. Dr. Mihaela Voinea, the author of the book "Critical thinking-Metacompetence for the society of the future", released by the Publishing House of Transilvania University of Brasov.


An equally intensely debated topic was the one related to emotional education, analysed based on the book coordinated by Alain de Botton: "An Emotional Education" from Vellant Publishing House. The professors involved in dialogue – Lect. Dr. Cornelia Lazăr, Lect. Dr. Alina Turculeț and Lect. Dr. Nicoleta Lupu – analysed the diversity of emotional states in relation to self, others and education.

Even though the debate took place online, the number of participants confirmed that there is preoccupation dialogue, for education and for "helping each other to evolve towards the best version of ourselves." (Botton, 2020, p.192).

LAUNCH OF THE THIRD EDITION OF THE ACADEMYDE OF ONLINE

The Faculty of Sociology and Communication, in partnership with the agencies <u>The Pharmacy</u> and <u>Romanian Copywriter</u> of Braşov launched on 3 March 2021 the third edition of the Academy of Online, a free introductory programme in digital marketing, which offers its attendants the opportunity to interact with experienced specialists.



If last year we managed to have two physical courses, and the following eight were online because of the pandemic, at this year's edition, organized in four modules of two courses extending over eight weeks, the courses will be organized 100 % online.




The courses are taught by four marketing specialists and entrepreneurs, graduates of Transilvania University of Brașov, who currently work in the two local agencies: Ovidiu Bălcăcian, co-founder of *The Pharmacy*, whereas from *Romanian Copywriter* - Cătălin Ionașcu (Project

Manager), Andrei Prescură (SEO & Content Strategist) and Zoe-Larisa Bădoiu (Copywriter).



The examples and exercises included in the course come from the experience of the trainers themselves, who have been involved in digital marketing for over eight years.



During the courses, the practical component is successfully combined with the theoretical benchmarks, and at the end of the programme the students will have the opportunity to apply all the knowledge acquired in a mini-project that will be evaluated to obtain a diploma.

MUSIC COMBINED WITH FURNITURE DESIGN AND RESTORATION

On 2 March 2021, on the occasion of the Day of Transilvania University of Braşov, the Faculty of Furniture Design and Wood Engineering brought together two events in its exhibition site: the concert of classical guitar given by Zsombor Filip and organized by "Norbert Detaye" Media Library of Transilvania University of Braşov; the exhibition for the restoration of wooden objects, organized by the Faculty of Furniture Design and Wood Engineering and coordinated by Prof. Dr. Chem. Maria Cristina Timar.





Zsombor Filip began his studies at Mikes Kelemen Theoretical High School, and from the 9th grade he was a pupil of Plugor Sándor High School of Arts in Sfântu Gheorghe, class of the teacher Kakasi Zsolt, and he regularly attended the guitar courses of the teacher Costin Soare (Bucharest). He participated in master classes in the country and in Hungary with teachers such as Costin Soare (Ro), Kónya István (Hu), Csáki András (Hu), Gabriel Bianco (Fr), Pavlovits Dávid (Hu), Pusztai Antal (Hu), Cătălin Ștefănescu (Ro), Javier Villafuerte (Es), Liviu Georgescu (Ro) and Antoine Moriniere (Fr). He has performed as a soloist of Georgius Chamber Orchestra (conductor Werner Gábor, Budapest) and gave recitals in Brașov, Sfântu Gheorghe, Arcuș Cultural Centre, Miercurea Ciuc, Târgu Mureș, the Hungarian Institute in Bucharest, Sutu Palace of Bucharest, the Romanian Athenaeum. He is a multiple winner of various national and international Olympiads and competitions. In the academic year 2018-2019 he was an Erasmus grantee at Ferenc Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest, in the classical guitar class of Professor Csáki András. He is currently a fourthyear student in the class of Prof. Dr. Corneliu Voicescu, within the Faculty of Music of Transilvania University of Brasov.



The programme offered was original and precious, being at the same time a complex and representative vision of his musical personality: Agustín Barrios Mangoré (1885–1944): Waltz op. 8, no. 4; Dan Dediu (1967–): Zemrude (of the cycle "Invisible Cities"); Dávid Pavlovits (1973-): Prelude no. 3 – "The Hawk"; Prelude no. 4 – "The Blue One"; Prelude no. 5 – "Bagatelle; Isaac Albéniz (1860–1909): "Mallorca" (Barcarola), op. 202; Andrew York (1958–): "Home"; João Pernambuco (1910–1947): Sons de Carrilhoes.

The restoration exhibition included furniture objects, as well as other wooden objects restored by students, under the coordination of the team led by Prof. Dr. Chem. Maria Cristina Timar, being completed by pieces of furniture - original creations of the students, as well as by five chairs representative for the design of contemporary furniture belonging to "Modern Classics" collection of "Norbert Detaye" Media Library. The event took place physically; the public access was free, all applicable preventive measures were observed, and physical distancing was ensured.

Through this action, it has been demonstrated, once again, that music combined with design and restoration can produce a much-needed state of well-being and comfort during this period, and true healing begins when live music returns, as stated by one of the great friends of "Norbert Detaye" Media Library and of Braşov, the musician Paul Brandes: "The greatest healing will be when live music comes back".

VISIT OF THE FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS TO THE TWO RESEARCH CENTRES OF THE FACULTY OF MATERIALS SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

Moreover, they actively participated in making heat treatments, including induction heating followed by hardening.

Following this visit, the students expressed their desire to spend as much time as possible and to join the activities carried out within the presented research centres.

The *Virtual Welding* simulator is a system designed to train and improve the practical skills needed by the students in the specialization of Welding Engineering.



The competition organized on 01.03.2021 was attended by the students at the bachelor's programmes of the Faculty of Materials Science and Engineering. The competition consisted of two virtual welding tests: procedure 135 (MAG) and position PA, the winner being designated based on the total score obtained in the two tests.

The winner of the competition was Robert Petruţ, a 1st-year student in Welding Engineering within the faculty of SIM; and the second and third places were occupied by Dragoş Spridon, respectively Edith Moldovan, 4th-year students in Welding Engineering.



This virtual welding competition has become a tradition within Transilvania University of Braşov; and from next year the competition will take place at inter-university level.

LISZT AND THE ROMANTIC ORGAN

The Music Centre of Transilvania University of Braşov has been hosting the most modern digital organ in the country for several years; therefore, the presence on the stage of "Sergiu T. Chiriacescu" Aula of this instrument, during the Concert Season, is, for performers and audience, an exceptional event with a pronounced festive aura.



Moreover, the significance and place of the organ in the cultural evolution of Braşov are of prime relevance, as we can consider it a motivation and a catalyst for young performers who, at the moment, are in full formative approach.

For certain, the above words also include the two performers who held the concert on 3 March 2021, Iulia Reitu and Geanina Sălăgean – the first graduates of the organ class within the Faculty of Music, coordinated by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Steffen Schlandt, already an authority and a valuable exponent of Braşov tradition in the multifaceted field of the organ.

programme proposed reference works belonging to the romantic repertoire for organ: Franz Liszt and Gustav Merkel, the latter a refined continuator of the Bach tradition, less known to the general public due to the specificity of his compositions. In fact, the performance of the entire recital was marked by denotative or connotative references of this great master of the organ who was Johann Sebastian Bach, in the first instance through the very substance of the chosen repertoire: Prelude and Fugue on the melogram B-A-C-H, performed by Iulia Reitu (4th-year, Bachelor's degree), respectively Variations on a basso continuo from the Cantata "Weinen, Klagen, Sorgen, Zagen" performed by Geanina Sălăgean (2nd-year, Master's degree), both works composed by the well-known romantic piano virtuoso, Franz Liszt.



Both the latter ones and Sonata op. 30 for organ, four hands and four feet, by Gustav Merkel, aroused from the performers a deep effort to internalize the semantics encoded in the score, to concentrate and support the interpretive dynamics, as well as to technically render the passages with a high degree of difficulty, through the adaptation to the desideratum of virtuosity demanded by Liszt's scores, and through the perfect coordination imposed by Merkel's Sonata. With the fulfilment of these desiderata, the proof of which is attested in the recital of 3 March 2021, the two performers proved that they acquired, within the institution of Braşov, the accomplishment necessary to access as successors of their professor and of the rich local tradition, a continuation on which the prevalence and the permanence of our cultural space depend, from this perspective.

We hope that the digital organ on the Aula stage, also through the advantage conferred by the versatility of the event space, is a symbol of the university which meant for Iulia Reitu a motivation towards continuous improvement, and for Geanina Sălăgean, already a graduate of the doctoral cycle of the University of Music in Bucharest, a catalyst for performance.

Moreover, we are also convinced that the two graduates are pioneers on a wide way reserved for the organ class of Professor Steffen Schlandt, a way outlined by the imperative of excellence which is always confirmed during the events of the Concert Season.

DAY OF TRANSILVANIA UNIVERSITY OF BRAŞOV. GALA OF MUSIC DOCTORAL STUDENTS

The Music Centre organized a special concert this year as well, to mark the anniversary of the Day of Transilvania University of Braşov: *Gala of Music Doctoral Students*, an event in which the evolution of doctoral students in the field of Music could be watched.



The spectators of the event which was broadcast online in the afternoon of 1 March 2021, on the University's website and on the Facebook page of the Music Centre, could listen to splendid vocal pages created by composers such as Giuseppe Verdi, Jules Massenet, Giacomo Puccini, Ruggero Leoncavallo, Alfredo Catalani, Erik Satie, Emerich Kalman or Franz Lehar, in the top-level performance of the sopranos Edith Adetu, Emilia Calefariu, Anda Pop and Renata Vari. The delicate phrases of Romance in F major, op. 50 by L. van Beethoven shone in the performance proposed by Radu Ropotan (violin) and Ana-Maria Negrea (piano). One of the most famous works of the composer Pablo Sarasate, Zigeunerweisen, presented during this event in the performance of Magdalena Lazar Boroș (violin) and of Botond Szocs (piano), impressed by the virtuosity of the execution and the depth of the interpretation. Concerto in C major for bassoon and *orchestra* by J. F. Fasch stood out due to the elegant and refined interpretation of the two performers.

The beauty and depth of the works presented in this concert were highlighted due to the high quality performances, the goals of the Music Centre being achieved this time as well: the presentation of a wide range of musical styles, materialized in the selection of representative works and the promotion of exceptional artists in events that meet the highest musical standards.

RHYTHM, MELODY AND HARMONY IN A MUSIC WORKSHOP

With the arrival of spring and after a long break from social activities, the students of the Faculty of Music, together with their professors, celebrated the Day of Transilvania University of Brașov in a music education workshop. The workshop was coordinated by Prof. Dr. Madalina Rucsanda and Lect.
