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GOVERNORS FROM THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION ACADEMY OF THE REPUBLIC OF ARMENIA VISIT THE FACULTY OF PRODUCT DESIGN AND ENVIRONMENT

Between 3-10 April, the University welcomed guests from Yerevan, Armenia, within the framework of the ERASMUS+ KA107 mobility project. There is a long-standing, rich collaboration with the Public Administration Academy of the Republic of Armenia within the LNSS project – *Library Network Support Services*, an ERASMUS+ *Capacity Building* project whose coordinator was this very institution, and the Faculty of Product Design and Environment was a member and partner.



The guests, namely Dr Arsen Lokyan, Rector of the university, and Dr Theresa Khechoyan, Vice-rector, met with Dr Carmen Buzea, Vice-rector for research and IT, Dr Camelia Drăghici, International Relations

Office, and Dr Ana Ispas, distance learning coordinator.

The current collaboration and particularly the future collaboration plans between the two institutions were discussed during the visit at the Faculty of Product Design and Environment, where the guests met with Dr Codruța Jaliu, Dean of the faculty and other faculty staff; this was also an opportunity to see the labs destined for Optometry, Medical Engineering, and Product Design.

Finer aspects of the collaboration between the two institutions were also approached during the meetings with Dr Mariela Pavalache, Dr Gabriel Brătucu, Dr Claudiu Coman, Deans of the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences, the Faculty of Economic Sciences, and the Faculty of Sociology and Communication respectively, as well as with the Erasmus coordinator and management of the Faculty of Sociology and Communication.

The talks resulted in the outline of several collaboration paths, among which the development of joint activities developed with these faculties, the development of mobility projects, participations in conferences, co-organizing a conference on *Neuromarketing*, creating partnerships to apply for research projects in competitions and devise a joint program for coordinating doctoral and distance learning students.

Chess pieces with little spikes, Braille elements, relief boards, the adapted centimeter, the sensory glove, the smart walking stick for visually impaired people, various smartphone apps. All these practical inventions were presented during the first edition of *Special Psychopedagogy Day*, which will hopefully become a tradition at the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences.

On 8 April the students at the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences experienced and learned new things masterfully facilitated by professionals in the field of special psychopedagogy: Mr Viorel Dumitru Micu, former student and interpreter of Vasile Adamescu, Mr Virgil Lazăr, President of the Brașov branch of the Romanian Association for the Blind, and Dr Mihaela Baritz from the Faculty of Product Design and Environment.



They were joined by partners from the School Center for Inclusive Education Braşov, represented by Mr Gabor Orban, principal, and Ms Tamara Brătucu, vice-principal, whose center is the setting where our students from the Special Psychopedagogy program can practice their specialized and pedagogical skills.



Some of the objectives of this event were the development of a deeper understanding of the ways to approach sensory deficiencies by exposing the students to formative and interdisciplinary presentations, in close connecting with the acquisition of the intervention skills required when working with special needs learners.

A subsidiary aim related to promoting an interinstitutional collaboration apt to meet the trainingdevelopment needs of the stakeholders (students, teachers, and representatives of various institutions).

The guests' presentations which balanced the theoretical knowledge on sensory deficiencies, field work, and moving case studies sensitised the students to various issues, strengthening their belief that, despite all obstacles, perseverance and genuine support from all those around us open the world to any one of us.

WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS DAY AT BRAŞOV

The World Autism Awareness Day is celebrated internationally on 2nd of April each year. At Brașov, this year's slogan was "Light it up blue for autism".



The event was organized by the Crystal Children Association in partnership with Transilvania University of Brașov, and consisted in three public activities, with the participation and involvement of the students from the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences and the Faculty of Sociology and Communication.



The first activity, held at the Multicultural Center, was a three-hour seminar on the inclusiveness of children with special educational needs; the facilitator was Maria Mădălina Turza, expert in inclusive psychology and public politics for inclusive education, and president of the European Centre for the Rights of Children with Disabilities in Bucharest (ECRCD). The seminar was aimed especially at the students from the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences enrolled in the

study programs Special Psychopedagogy and Pedagogy of Primary and Preschool Education.



The second activity was a symbolic march with blue balloons. The participants were children in the Crystal Children Association, their parents, guest Maria Mădalina Turza, tens of students and professors at Transilvania University of Brașov, and volunteers, in support of people diagnosed with autism or other associated disorders.



The day ended spectacularly with the third activity, namely the lighting of symbolic blue on three iconic buildings in Braşov: the Citadel, City Hall, and Council House.

STUDENTS AT THE FACULTY OF LAW PARTICIPATE IN THE INTER-UNIVERSITY MOCK TRIAL COMPETITION, GALAȚI

On 19 April, Diana Adriana Cernat, Ilinca Florina Iosu, Carmen Beatrice Enache, Mihaela Daniela Hofner, Maria Ghilencea, Radu Stan, senior students at the Faculty of Law, under the supervision of Dr Andreea Cătălina Ciurea, Dr Bianca Georgeta Spîrchez, and Dr Oana Şaramet, participated in the second National Mock Trial Competition, organized at the Faculty of Juridical, Social and Political Sciences at "Dunărea de Jos" University of Galaţi, in collaboration with the Faculty of Law at Transilvania University of Braşov.



The two competing teams consisted of six students. Each team included three pleading lawyers, the plaintiff/defendant, and two witnesses. Our team acted on behalf of the defendant in a legal case related to Family Law and Civil Law.



According to the rules, both in the written and oral stages of the competition, our faculty's students stood out owing to their extensive legal expertise, ease of making pertinent and compelling juridical arguments, and abilities and skills specific to any legal practitioner, which they managed to acquire and develop throughout their academic studies.

In this competition, the students at the Faculty of Law won the awards for the best plea and for the best witness.

An entrepreneurship bootcamp was organized between 10 and 15 April, within the frame of a partnership with the Chamber of Commerce of Belgium. It involved students from our university and 40 students from high profile Belgian universities. The six days of the bootcamp were devoted to a series of workshops on entrepreneurship-related topics, meetings with successful entrepreneurs and visits to various companies and start-ups in Brașov and Bucharest. Among the local companies visited were Mondly, and Preh—that were also partners in this event.



The visits to the local enterprises and entrepreneurs scheduled during the first half of the bootcamp have managed to break the ice between our students and their Belgian peers.

They benefitted from a one-off experience during which they encountered real-life situations that tested their professional abilities. This event was also intended as a step forward towards strengthening the relationship between Transilvania University of Braşov and Ghent University.



This is the feedback given by two of the Belgian students: "I've learned a lot about entrepreneurship these days, but what I'm most glad about is the wonderful people that I've met here. A highlight of this event was the presence, on 11 April of HE, Mr Thomas Baekelandt, Ambassador of Belgium. He shared with both students and local businesspeople toughts about his diplomatic mission and about the business environment. A networking event took place later during the day, which facilitated the interactions between the students and the entrepreneurs.



Initiated and coordinated by Mr Andrei Neagu, Manager of *Tomorrow Hub*, the event successfully managed to raise the students' awareness as to the opportunities in the area of entrepreneurship, while also contributing towards establishing a closer connection between Transilvania University of Braşov and Ghent University.

180 YEARS SINCE THE INAUGURATION OF THE BLACK CHURCH ORGAN. CONFERENCE AND ORGAN. CONCERT

On 17 April, a conference held at our university's Aula Magna marked 180 years since the inauguration of the *Buchholz* mechanical organ in the Black Church at Brașov. On this occasion, the Black Church organist Steffen Schlandt performed compositions by J.S. Bach, J. Messner and P. Richter. This event was special because of the amount and quality of the information shared through very interesting audio-visual material, but also because our university's digital organ was set to the frequency and timber of the Black Organ church, so that the original sonority of the musical pieces was preserved.



The initial organ of the Black Church (first recorded in texts as St. Mary Church) was built in the altar, in 1499, modified in 1594, and expanded in 1673. After the fire of 1689, Johannes Vest, a renowned organ builder, made a new organ—also located in the altar—using the remains of the old one to which he added new parts.



Meanwhile, the place at the balcony was prepared for the *Buchholz* organ, built between 1836 and 1839. At that time, it was one of the most important organs in Europe. Apart from some minor repairs, it has to this day endured in its original form.

Steffen Schlandt is the ideal type of organist with a deep understanding of music deriving from an indepth study of the music sheet. He also possesses a general aesthetics background, a sound musical culture, intuition and sense, which together with his technique, reveal and complement his style. For Steffen Schlandt the form takes a wide range of sonorous perspectives, nothing is excessive, and the listener is in permanent contact with the musician. His studies at Cluj (the organ section) followed by special training in Trossingen, Germany (in church music), and in Würzburg (as choir and orchestra conductor), combined with his passion for organ music validated his unique standing in the cultural life of Braṣov, as organist and musicologist.


The date at which the event was set is not random: it was on 16 April 1944 that the first bomb attack of the allies was launched on Braşov.



The framework of this special event was the project Europe for Citizens *ACT-ACTive Telling, ACTive Learning,* in which Transilvania University is also a partner. The other partner institutions are from Italy, Slovenia, Croatia and Poland.

THE KUMMER-VANDIVER CONJECTURE - A LECTURE ON ALGEBRA



The Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science welcomed a very special guest, Prof. Preda Mihăilescu, one of the most widely known Romanian mathematicians, from *Mathematisches Institut, Georg-August-Universität*, Goettingen, Germany.

Prof. Mihăilescu went down in the history of mathematics in 2002 when he demonstrated a famous conjecture formulated in 1844 by Eugène Catalan. The result is known nowadays as Mihăilescu's *theorem*.

Dr Mihăilescu studied at the leading Swiss university *ETH-Zürich*, where he also defended his PhD thesis on *Cyclotomy of rings and primality testing*. Currently, he is tenured professor at Goettingen, having as main research directions the *Iwasawa* theory, the Diophantine equations, and the algorithmic theory of numbers.

Professor Mihăilescu visited our faculty on 14 May, when he delivered a remarkable and much applauded lecture on the *Kummer–Vandiver* conjecture. A feat of mathematical refinement, his much-awaited talk was attended by an eager audience of students and faculty staff.

In recognition of their hard work, each student symbolically received a restorer card, issued by the *Antique IL* Restoration Club, a student-founded club set up within the *My Faculty* scheme, in 2015. Students actively participated in designing the Furniture restoration lab and in compiling a restoration database. Furthermore, several students volunteered for events concerned with the wood heritage conservation.



COMMUNICATING WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES. A PRACTICAL COURSE

On 17 April, junior students from the Faculty of Communication and Public Relations attended a lecture given by Marie Louise Aastrup, doctoral student at *Memorial University* New Foundland, Canada. The Danish researcher, who is also the recipient of a fellowship program within the Romanian Academy, lectured on applying mixed research methods in achieving communication plans with local communities.



Although her current research topic is connected to natural heritage conservation and the conflicts generated by using natural areas, the students were able to find out about the concrete challenges posed by the communication with local communities.

These examples were excerpted from the research conducted by Marie Louise Aastrup in the Făgăraș Mountains over the past two years, a research focused on investigating the proposals of different local authorities regarding the construction of a National Park in the area, and at providing a historical backdrop to the local stories on the conservation of the natural heritage.

In her fieldwork as well as in setting up of interviews, Marie Louise Aastrup was assisted by a senior student from the Faculty of Sociology and Communication.

CONTEMPORARY LITERATURE OF GERMAN EXPRESSION

At the invitation of the Faculty of Letters, the writers Carmen Elisabeth Puchianu, Horst Samson and Traian Pop met at the Multicultural Center of the University of Transylvania for an afternoon of reading.



In the presentation, the moderator of the meeting, Adrian Lăcătuş, the dean of the Faculty of Letters, emphasized the importance of German expression literature for the Romanian literature of the 1970s - 80s and its influence on the eighties poets, noting, at

the same time, that Traian Pop continues as an editor promoting the writers' work which was made before 1989 by the Kriterion publishing house.

Traian Pop also spoke about the niche in the literature market, which is addressed to writers of German expression. Horst Samson read from his new works "Das Imaginaere und anoere Anwesenheit darin" and "Heimat als Versuchung - das nackte Leben", Carmen Elisabeth Puchianu from "Die Professoressa. Erotikon in gebundener and ungebundener Rede", and Traian Pop from "Bleierne Fluegel" and "Absolute Macht".

The author Horst Samson mentioned the political context in which he wrote the literature, considering it in the 80s as a valve that helps you to live and survive. The public reading ended with a dialogue between writers and the public.

At the end of March, 50 participants from 16 countries came to Bucharest, Romania, for the first regional *GEDC Industry Forum*, organized in partnership with Petrus Communications. Transilvania University of Brașov was a key partner of this event. The program focused on encouraging innovation by facilitating the participation of representatives of universities and industry leaders, by addressing the ever-widening gap between digital skills and the absence of skills and by developing key skills, including intra-entrepreneurial skills, with a view to introducing young people into the labor market.

The team sessions, presentations and interactivity of the event were the most appreciated aspects, and the participants showed a high interest in joining the next GEDC Industry Forum.

Central and Eastern Europe has one of the greatest development potentials, and through this event the GEDC has expanded its network, connecting with deans and representatives of major industries in this important strategic part of the world.

The audience had the chance to listen to 46 voices combined to perform a series of different musical creations. The concert was planned by the conductor

Richard Pinel, musical director of Jesus Cambridge College and head of the Edington Music Festival.

The program included classical and gospel religious choral creations, both *a capella* and with organ accompaniment from the organists David Rees and Jason Richards.

RAMONA OROS - A GRADUATE DESIGNING THE FUTURE IN BRUXELLES





Ramona Oros graduated 10 years ago, as part of the second class of the Telecommunications study program at the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science. Then she graduated from the part-time program of International Economic Relations at the Faculty of Economic Sciences and **Business** Administration. She also completed the Master's program "Entrepreneurship and Leadership". Her graduate studies afforded her the opportunity to interact with the local businesses and to understand the importance of European funds in their development, which subsequently influenced the course of her career.

She also continued her training in the technical field as part of the Doctoral School at the Faculty of Materials Science and Engineering, in collaboration with the Centre for Valorization and Transfer of Competence. Her research focused on distance wireless measurements of temperatures for the industrial galvanization equipment, a toxic environment that makes this approach necessary. The study resulted in a system that is still in use today in the galvanizing hall at IAR Brasov. Being enrolled in an EU-funded doctoral program, she had the opportunity to undergo a three-month internship abroad at Carinthia University of Applied Sciences - Villach, Austria. This study visit paved the way for a future collaboration, because at the end of her PhD program she returned to Carinthia University of Applied Sciences in order to start her professional career, first as Junior Researcher and then as Assistant Manager on European projects.

Her career turned towards European funding opportunities in education. During the five years she spent at *Carinthia University of Applied Sciences*, she

was involved as a research team member, then as coordinator at department level, in 14 more projects.

Pursuing her interest in keeping abreast with the current technological developments, she left the academia and started working in the management of European projects. Thus, she became Project Acquisition Manager for an organization meant to support the collaboration between industry and education in the field of renewable energy, mobility and everything related to developing a safer, cleaner and more pleasant environment for future generations. In this context, she had the chance to coordinate a major project at the European level, in the field of urban mobility, supported by the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT), a program of the European Commission that funds research, collaboration with the industry and the business environment by promoting innovative solutions, regardless of their origin. She believed that the motto of this organization, as well as its long term plans were really useful, this is why she became Innovation Analyst at EIT Digital, position which gives her the possibility to apply the technical and economic knowledge she acquired during her years of study at our university, her experience in European projects, and, at the same time, challenges her to participate in defining the directions in which the digital world is going to develop in the years to come.

Her plans are to be actively involved in the development of European programs through solutions meant to support valuable initiatives, regardless of the field, with the aim of creating a pleasant social, economic and cultural environment for the next generations. She is currently working in Brussels, occupying a position from which she can substantially help the digital development of her native country with the help of European funds.
